
## RESEARCHING

Researching provides students with an excellent opportunity to choose a topic of interest and practicing those research skills. "




### Evaluating sources cheat sheet



## WRITING YOUR PAPER

Avoiding Plagiarism

Plagiarism is the act of taking someone's words and using them as your own without proper citation.

Use this rule of thumb

" if you copy and paste, place in quotes"
